

## **JBNA Directors' Report: August 8, 2017**

### ***WASTEWATER (SEWAGE) UPDATE:***

The "jack hammer" part of the drilling for the undersea horizontal pipe to McLoughlin Point is complete. We were informed that this was the noisiest part of the process so things should be noticeably quieter. The horizontal drilling has started and it is expected to take one year to complete the undersea horizontal direction drill from Ogden Point to McLoughlin Point. The most recent Wastewater Treatment Project report indicates that the drilling will take place six days a week:

Monday to Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Saturday, 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

There will not be road closures and access to local businesses will be maintained.
